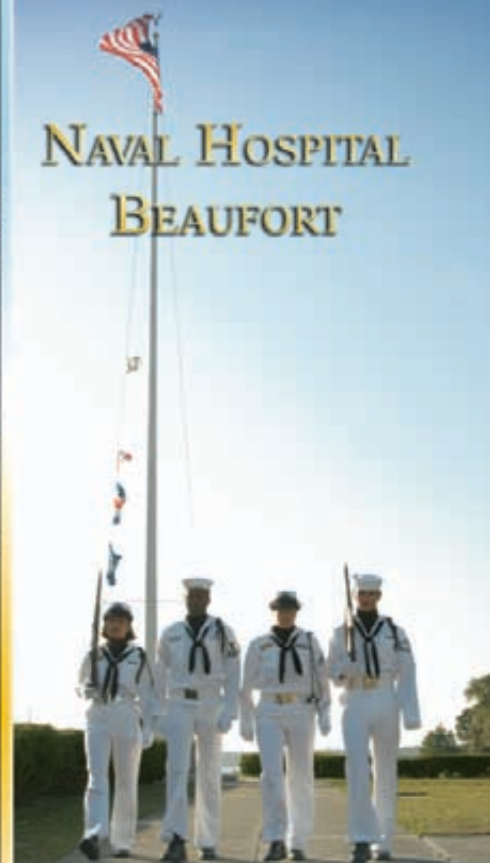

Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island

Welcome

The mission of the Marine Corps Recruit Depot is two-fold. First, it trains male recruits who have enlisted from the Eastern Recruiting Region, an area east of the Mississippi River. It also trains all female recruits from across the nation. Secondly, Parris Island is the headquarters of the Eastern Recruiting Region, which oversees the Corps' recruiting efforts at three district headquarters and 23 recruiting stations.

There are three recruiting districts east of the Mississippi. The 1st Marine Corps District is located in Garden City, N.Y., the 4th MCD is in Harrisburg, Pa., and the 6th MCD is headquartered at Parris Island.

Additionally, the Depot houses a school to train drill instructors and a Weapons and Field Training Battalion that serves not only Marines, but other services as well.

Location

The Marine Corps Recruit Depot is located in the Southeastern corner of South Carolina's Lowcountry within Beaufort County, 70 miles south of Charleston and 45 miles north of Savannah, Ga. Its 8,095 acres (of which 3,262 are habitable) are picturesque and sit only 20 feet above sea level.

Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort

Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort is home to Marine Aircraft Group 31, one of the largest F/A-18 aircraft groups, which includes approximately 4,200 Marines and Sailors working here. Its size, combined with MAG-31's reputation for tactical proficiency, has earned the Air Station the title "Fightertown."

The Air Station covers 6,900 acres within Beaufort County and controls an additional 5,200 acres at the Townsend Bombing Range in Macintosh County, Ga. This range is managed by the Georgia Air National Guard and provides Fightertown pilots the opportunity to train for air-ground combat.

Naval Hospital Beaufort

Welcome

Naval Hospital Beaufort is located just off Ribaut Road, on the Beaufort River. It is approximately halfway between the Marine Corps Air Station and Parris Island. The Naval Hospital command consists of the Naval Base and two Branch Medical Clinics, one at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island, and the other at Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort.

Located on the grounds of the Naval Hospital are 53 family housing units, two Bachelor Enlisted Quarters able to accommodate 190 residents, a Navy Exchange retail store, optical shop, vending machine courts, gas station and a mini-mart. This command also has a complete Public Works facility. Recreational facilities include: Special Services office, softball fields, swimming pool, lighted tennis and basketball courts, outdoor fitness court, fishing pier, children's playground, and a picnic area with sheltered barbecue sites.

Naval Hospital Beaufort administers TRICARE, the Department of Defense's managed health care program for active duty members, military families and

retirees. One of the key features to TRICARE is TRICARE PRIME, the Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) style plan that allows Beaufort's PRIME

enrollees the advantage of having all of their health care needs coordinated by a team of professional health care providers 24-hours a day at NHB.

The Naval Hospital provides outpatient care to TRICARE PRIME enrolled beneficiaries on an appointment basis. To enroll or for more information on the TRICARE Program, visit the TRICARE Services Center located on the first floor of the hospital or call 525-9415.

Emergency Medical Care

In an emergency, 911 should be called for ambulance service. The Naval Hospital Beaufort Emergency Room is open 24-hours a day. The direct phone numbers to the ER are 228-5400/5401.

6th Marine Corps District

The 6th Marine Corps District (6th MCD) encompasses the eight Southeastern states of Tennessee, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, East Central Mississippi, Florida, and Louisiana as well as Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

Its primary mission is command and control of recruiting within the Southeastern United States.

In July 1996, the 6th MCD headquarters was relocated to Parris Island from Atlanta, Ga., to save valuable tax dollars and improve the quality of life for its service members. It is now located in the newly refurbished Bldg. 903.

The 6th MCD was established in 1946. Prior to that year, the administration of voluntary enlistment was done at various Marine Corps recruiting offices, posts and stations throughout the south, coordinated through the Southeastern Recruiting District Headquarters in New Orleans, Louisiana. Over the years, the District has borne several titles:

1937-19456th Reserve District
1946-19526th Marine Corps Reserve
1953-1963.....6th Reserve
and Recruitment District
1964-present .6th Marine Corps District

In 1976, recruiting operations were streamlined when the enlisted recruiting functions were brought under the operational control of the commanding generals

of the East and West Coast Recruit Depots. The 6th MCD falls under the operational control of the Commanding General, Marine Corps Recruit Depot/Eastern Recruiting Region, Parris Island, S.C. Also, all reserve functions were transferred to the commanding generals, 4th Marine Division and 4th Marine Aircraft Wing, both headquartered in New Orleans, La. These changes were instrumental in gaining greater regulation of quality recruits bound for recruit training and the centralization of command and control of the combat-ready components of the United States Marine Corps Reserve.

In the late 1970s, the 6th MCD adopted the nickname "Pacesetters" for its achievements in recruiting when compared to the other Marine Corps Districts. The 6th MCD has led the nation several times in total force recruiting.

The 6th MCD is at present divided into eight individual Recruiting Stations. They are located in Atlanta, Ga., Columbia, S.C., Fort Lauderdale, Jacksonville and Orlando, Fla., Montgomery, Ala., Nashville, Tenn., and Baton Rouge, La.



Reporting In

Parris Island

All personnel reporting to Parris Island for duty during normal working hours 7:30a.m. - 4:30p.m., Monday through Friday) will report in uniform to the Depot Consolidated Administration Center, Bldg. 923. After working hours, on weekends and holidays, report to the Headquarters and Service Battalion Officer of the Day in Bldg. 144.

MCAS Beaufort

Service members with orders to MCAS Beaufort should report in at the Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, Bldg. 600 during regular duty hours. After hours, they should report to MCAS Headquarters Bldg. 601. Those reporting to Marine Aircraft Group 31, or its sub-units, should report at MAG-31 Headquarters Bldg. 585 at all times.

Naval Hospital Beaufort

Naval Hospital personnel should report to the Hospital Quarter Deck located at the Information Desk on the first floor (phone 228-5600).

Naval Dental Center

Naval Dental Center personnel should report to the clinic at Parris Island, Bldg. 674.

Vehicle Registration

The following is required for registration:

1. Valid Military ID card
2. Current state registration certificate
3. Valid state driver's license

4. Minimum insurance (liability \$15,000, personal injury - \$30,000, and \$5,000 property damage in any one accident.) Policies must include or have appended uninsured motorist coverage.
5. Application must be made in person at the Provost Marshals Office.
6. An immediate family member may apply for registration if the

application form has been signed by the military sponsor.

7. When a Power of Attorney is held by a spouse whose sponsor is overseas, he/she may sign the application for the sponsor.
8. Civilian employees, retired military members, and other civilians who have authorized registration privileges must apply in person.

Weapons Registration

All military personnel assigned to Parris Island, Marine Corps Air Station, or Naval Hospital Beaufort who own firearms of any kind must register them at the Provost Marshals Office (security office at the Naval Hospital). Further information may be found in Marine Corps Recruit Depot Order P5100.14D or by calling 228-2304.

Law Enforcement

Vehicle accidents occurring aboard a military installation must be promptly reported to the office of the Provost Marshal. All parties concerned and witnesses must remain at the scene until released by competent authority, except when medical attention is necessary to prevent death or prolonged suffering. Dial 911 while at Parris Island/MCAS/BNH to report emergencies and 228-3200 at Parris Island or 228-STOP at MCAS to anonymously report information about crimes. To report criminal acts occurring aboard the Naval Hospital, call 228-5327. To report routine items to the Military Police at Parris Island, dial 228-3118/3445 and at the Air Station, 228-7373. The Security Officer at the hospital can be reached at 228-5317. Crimes occurring off the military installations should be reported to the Beaufort County Sheriff's Office or the Beaufort City Police by dialing 911.

Traffic Regulations

The speed limits aboard the Air Station and Laurel Bay Housing areas are posted at the respective gates. Aboard the Naval Hospital and MCRD it is 25 mph unless otherwise posted. Parking is authorized in parking spaces only. Radar detectors are prohibited.

REMINDER: PLEASE YIELD TO VEHICLES DISPLAYING VISUAL OR AUDIBLE EMERGENCY SIGNALS

Seat belts and child car seats are required on and off the Tri-Command bases at all times in accordance with DoD regulations and South Carolina law.

Osprey Inn

Beaufort River Inn

(Visiting Officer Quarters)

Temporary accommodations are available to transient officers visiting the Depot. Reservations should be made at least two weeks in advance and confirmed within several days of the expected time of arrival by calling (843) 228-2744. Fax: (843) 228-3450.

Off-Base Housing Referral

The Off-Base Housing Referral Office, located in the Depot Housing Office, Bldg. 402 (Parris Island) (843) 228-3340, and Bldg. 1140 (MCAS) (843) 228-7069, maintains listings of housing available on a nondiscriminatory basis in the nearby civilian community at varying price ranges. All personnel are required to check with Housing Referral prior to making any commitment for off-base housing.

Parris Island Inn (TLF)

Temporary accommodations, not to exceed 30 days, are available by contacting the Temporary Lodging Facility, MCRD Parris Island, (843) 228-2976. This facility is completely equipped with private bath,





television, individual room heat and air, and a laundry facility. All rooms are equipped for double occupancy. Ten of these rooms have kitchenettes and are on a space available basis.

The deTreville House

The deTreville House at the Air Station is available to PCS, TAD, active duty and retired military families, and guests. A total of 42 units — 21 with full kitchens — are available. Reservations recommended. Call (843) 522-1663.

What's Available at Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort

The Air Station has 1,276 family housing units, which are capable of providing housing for a substantial majority of all eligible personnel. The Laurel Bay Housing complex contains 1,100 Capehart Single units.

An additional 176 units (22 single and 154 duplex units) are in Pine Grove 1 and 2 located aboard MCAS. All quarters contain central air conditioning and forced air heating.

In addition, there are 157 mobile home spaces located at the Laurel Bay Complex's mobile home park. There are 37 spaces, which will accommodate doublewide mobile homes.

Military personnel receiving BAH are required to report to the Housing Office upon arrival. All pay grades will receive information regarding availability of housing, assignment to quarters and housing referral if needed.

The office is in Bldg. 1140, adjacent to the Marine Corps Exchange complex, and can be reached by calling (843) 228-6000.

Bachelor Officers' Quarters

Bachelor Officers are quartered in the air-conditioned BOQ adjacent to the Officer's Club. Each room contains complete furnishings and an adjoining bath. Reservations can be made by calling (843) 228-7676.

Bachelor Enlisted Quarters (BEQ)

Enlisted personnel are billeted in a complex containing 14 motel type barracks featuring semi-private rooms with bath, and other barracks with semi-private rooms and communal bath facilities. E-4 and below are billeted two per room.

Naval Hospital Beaufort

The Naval Hospital has 53 family housing units, eight for officers and 45 for enlisted members. All units have three bedrooms and two full baths. Each

unit is equipped with a range, refrigerator and central heating and cooling system.

There are eight enlisted and three officer family housing units at Laurel Bay set aside for hospital personnel. Units are located about 15 miles from the hospital.

The Housing Office Bldg. is located adjacent to the Naval Hospital in the Public Works Office. For off-base housing listings, call the Housing Referral Office at Parris Island or the Air Station.

Bachelor Enlisted Quarters (BEQ)

The Naval Hospital has two BEQ's for enlisted personnel. For E-1 through E-6 personnel, BEQ-7 has 32 rooms and BEQ-148 has 64 rooms. Single E-5/E-6 personnel have private rooms with everyone else sharing a room with one other person. All BEQ's have laundry facilities, game rooms and color TVs (with cable) in all lounges and telephone jacks are installed in each room. A weight room is located in BEQ-7.

There is no charge to visit. The museum is open Monday through Wednesday and Saturday through Sunday from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; on Thursdays before graduation, 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.; on Friday 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and is closed Thanksgiving, and for an extended time over the Christmas and New Year's holidays. Parris Island

For thousands of years Parris Island was home to American Indians. In the 1520s the island was explored by Spanish seafarers. From 1562 to 1563 the French colony known as Charlesfort was located on Parris Island. The French were followed in 1566 by the Spanish who built the fortified village of Santa Elena, which served as the capital of Spanish Florida. Santa Elena was abandoned in 1587 and English colonists came to the region in the late 1660s. In 1735 descendants of Alexander Parris, owner and namesake of the Island, settled on Parris Island.

During the antebellum period, Parris Island was home to numerous Cotton Plantations worked by hundreds of African slaves. After the Civil War, a small farming community for former slaves lived on the island. In the 1880s a naval station was located on Parris Island, and in 1891 a Marine detachment arrived under the command of 1st Sergeant Richard Donovan. By the early twentieth century the majority of the naval activity had been shifted to Charleston, S.C., and on Nov. 1, 1915 the Marine Corps established a recruit depot on Parris Island.

Military buildings and homes constructed between 1891 and World War I form the nucleus of the Parris Island Historic District. At the district's center are the Commanding General's home, a 19th century wooden dry dock and a turn of the century gazebo, all of which are listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

On Nov. 1, 1915, male recruit training commenced and has continued since.

Prior to 1929, all transportation to and from the island was by ferry from Port Royal docks to the Recruit Depot docks. In that year, the causeway and a bridge over Archer's Creek were completed, thus ending the water transportation era. The causeway was dedicated the General E. Pollock Memorial Causeway in April 1984.

During the fateful December of 1941, 5,272 recruits arrived here with 9,206 arriving the following month, making it necessary to add the 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th Training Battalions. As the war influx continued, five battalions were sent to New River, N.C., to train and the Depot expanded to 13 battalions.

From 1941 through 1945, 204,509 recruits were trained here. At the time of the Japanese surrender, more than 20,000 recruits were aboard the Depot.



On Feb. 15, 1949, a separate command was activated for the sole purpose of training female Marine recruits. This command has since been designated the 4th Recruit Training Battalion and is the only such battalion in existence.

When the Korean War, began in 1950, 2,350 recruits were in training. March of 1952 marked the peak load with a recruit presence totaling 24,494. When the 1st Marine Division was withdrawn from Korea, Parris Island drill instructors had trained more than 138,000 recruits.

The recruit tide again flooded during the years of the Vietnam War. A peak training load of 10,979 was reached during March 1966.

Today, nearly 19,000 recruits are trained at Parris Island each year. Technological advances balanced with environmental concerns have enabled the island to grow into one of the most efficient and picturesque military reservations in the world.

MCAS Beaufort Squadron Histories

Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron

The lineage, history and mission of Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron is in line with that of Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort.

Personnel assigned to Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron operate the facilities that provide a home and a base of operations to FMF tenant units of the Second Marine Aircraft Wing and the Marine Logistics Group. Marine Aircraft Group 31 is the primary tenant command and consists of seven fighter attack squadrons, which fly and maintain all active duty East Coast Marine Corps F/A-18 Hornets and includes MALS-31.

Activated as Marine Corps Auxiliary Airfield in January 1955, the area was redesignated as Marine Corps Auxiliary

Air Station June 1956. On 1 March 1960, the auxiliary air station was redesignated a Marine Corps Air Station. The airfield at MCAS Beaufort was named Merritt Field in honor of Major General Lewie Merritt, USMC (retired), on 19 September 1975.

The military population of Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron is approximately 700 Marine and Navy personnel.

Our mission is to provide a total quality environment to enhance all tenant activities in the accomplishment of their assigned missions. This includes operating support aircraft, ensuring environmentally sound facilities and practices, providing quality services while utilizing our available resources, nurturing quality of life programs and conducting proactive community relations.

The awards presented to Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron, Marine Corps Air Station, Beaufort include the Meritorious Unit Commendation Streamer and the National Defense Service Streamer with one bronze star.



Combat Logistics Company 23

Combat Logistics Company 23 was activated as Combat Service Support Detachment 23, Detachment "B", 2nd Force Service Support Group, on November 26, 1976 to support Fleet Marine Force Atlantic units at Marine Corps Air Station, Beaufort, South Carolina. The name change from CSSD-23 to Combat Logistics Company 23 was made official in April 2005. The change came as part of a sweeping transformation of FSSGs to more effectively support current and future war fighting requirements. The unit will be referred to as CSSD-23 in portions of their history.

CLC-23 consists of an intermediate Maintenance shop, Supply section, Information Systems Management Officer and Medical section.

The primary mission of Det "B" was third echelon maintenance support on tactical motor transport and engineer equipment.

During April 10-14, 1978, the detachment participated in its first major support operation "Operation Night Owl." On May 4, 1981, General Support Unit personnel were assigned to 2d FSSG Det "B" to support ADPE-FMF operations at MCAS Beaufort.

Over several months in 1984-1985, Detachment "B" supported the Marines in Lebanon and naval personnel on ships by deploying Marines from various ships

within the unit, with skills ranging from heavy equipment operators and mechanics to computer programmers.

On July 22, 1987, Detachment "B" was re-designated as Combat Service Support Detachment Two-Three.

In 1990, the detachment provided a contact team to support Marine Wing Support Squadron 273 during movement to Florida in support of Operation Desert Shield. In June 1991, an additional thirteen Marines deployed to Southwest Asia as part of Combat Service Support Element, Military Prepositioning Force Reconstitution.

From 1994-1995 members of CSSD-23 augmented Joint Task Force 160 in Operation Sea Signal in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. JTF-160 took care of the significant migration of Haitians and Cubans, which required significant humanitarian assistance and security on naval base Guantanamo, Cuba.

In December 2001, the Commanding General, 2d Force Service Support Group approved a new detachment logo. The new logo was more descriptive of the maintenance mission of the now "Roughnecks" and displayed an F/A-18 Hornet to illustrate the direct role the detachment's mission has on keeping MAG-31 flying by helping to keep MWSS-73's ground equipment up and running.

In January 2002, 41 Marines and Sailors were deployed in support of Operation Enduring Freedom (OEF) and Operation Iraqi Freedom I (OIF-I).

In December 2002, Combat Service Support Detachment 23 increased its capability by assuming the 3d echelon maintenance of small arms, as well as establishing the Combat Service Support Detachment 23 ATLAS II+ help desk in support of all II MEF units located at Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort.

From 2003-2004 elements of CSSD-23 participated in support of the Global War on Terrorism, Horn of Africa.

In 2004 elements participated in support of Operation Secure Tomorrow, in Haiti.

Today Roughnecks from CLC-23 continue to support individual augment requirements in support of the Global War on Terrorism, while those at MCAS Beaufort continue to provide critical support of the units stationed here.

Marine Aircraft Group 31

Marine Aircraft Group 31 was commissioned at Cherry Point, North Carolina on February 1943. From October 1943 until 12 October 1945, the Group operated throughout the Pacific Area and played an integral part in the battle for Okinawa. Subsequent to the seizure of Okinawa, MAG-31 squadrons continued their part in the war conducting operations from Yontan Airfield on the island. While on Okinawa, MAG-31 was commanded by Colonel John C. Munn, who later became a Lieutenant General and Assistant Commandant of the Marine Corps.



On 12 October 1945, the Group departed Okinawa for Yokosuka, Japan becoming the first Marine land-based Group to operate in the Japanese homeland. The Group was transferred from the 2dMAW to the 4th MAW on 12 February 1946, and then to the Fleet Marine Force Pacific on 13 March 1946.

The Group returned to the United States on 5 July 1946 and was stationed at the Marine Corps Air Station, Miramar, San Diego, California until it was decommissioned on 31 May 1947.

MAG-31 was reactivated on 17 March 1952 at Cherry Point, North Carolina and transferred to Marine Corps Air Station, Miami, Florida operating as a part of the 3d MAW until it was again decommissioned in 1958.

On 1 November 1961, MAG-31 was again reactivated and stationed at its present home, Marine Corps Air Station, Beaufort, South Carolina, as part of the 2d MAW.

The mission of Marine Aircraft Group 31 is to conduct anti-air warfare

and offensive air support operations in support of Fleet Marine Forces from advance bases, expeditionary airfields, and aircraft carriers, and to conduct such other air operations as may be directed.

The MAG currently operates at a high tempo supporting Operations Iraqi and Enduring Freedom and the Unit Deployment Program in the Pacific.

Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron 31

The Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron 31 along with Marine Aircraft Group 31, Headquarters Squadron 31 was activated on 1 February 1943 at Marine Corps Air Station, Cherry Point, North Carolina, as an element of the 3rd Aircraft Wing, Fleet Marine Force.

Between 7 April and 15 August 1945, personnel from Headquarters Squadron 31 supported the tactical aircrews of MAG-31 who flew 38,187 hours and shot down 191 enemy planes. Multiple missions were flown over Okinawa, southern Kyushu, the China coast and more than a dozen enemy-held islands between Formosa and Kyushu. By the end of the Ryukyus Campaign, MAG-31 units had moved from Yontan to Chimu on Okinawa.

On 12 October 1945, Headquarters Squadron 31 departed Okinawa for the Marine Air Base at Yokosuka, Japan, as MAG-31 became the first Marine land-based air group to operate on the Japanese homeland. By July 1946, MAG-31 and its elements were operating out of the Marine Corps Air Station, Miramar, California, where they remained until deactivation on 31 May 1947.

Headquarters Squadron 31 was reactivated at MCAS Cherry Point, North Carolina, on 17 March 1952 and moved to MCAS Miami, Florida. On 15 February 1954, Headquarters Squadron 31 was redesignated Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 31.

Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 31 was redesignated on 22 August 1958, as it became part of the 2d Marine Aircraft Wing, AirFMFLant. The squadron, along with the group, was reduced to a cadre status and moved to Cherry Point, North Carolina. Within three years, the squadron returned to full operational status.

After reactivation on 1 November 1961, Headquarters and Maintenance

Squadron 31 was reestablished at MCAS Beaufort, South Carolina. Personnel provided logistical and administrative support to MAG-31 units and augmented deployed tactical squadrons. Additionally, the squadron provided proficiency training for attached pilots with C-117D and T-1A aircraft.

During November 1968, the squadron received the Commanding General, FMFLant aviation Safety Award for supporting 2,029 mishap-free flight hours. In the ensuing twenty-year period, Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 31 participated in a multitude of training and deployment exercises in support of MAG-31 flying squadrons. Throughout, the squadron focused on sustaining readiness, enhancing combat capabilities and providing around the clock logistics support.

On 1 October 1988, Headquarters and Maintenance Squadron 31 was redesignated Marine Aviation Logistics Squadron 31, and in 1990, successfully completed the transition of its aviation logistics support mission from the F-4 Phantom to the F/A-18 Hornet.

Since its establishment, the Marines and Sailors of MALS-31 have provided on-going support wherever MAG-31 squadrons are deployed-stateside and abroad, from land and from sea-including Operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm; Operations Deny Flight, Joint Endeavor, and Decisive Edge in Bosnia; Operations Noble Anvil, Allied Force and Joint Guardian in Serbia and Kosovo; Operation Enduring Freedom onboard USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN-71); and Operation Iraqi Freedom in Iraq as well as onboard the USS Truman (CVN-75) and USS Enterprise (CVN-65).

VMFA-115 "Silver Eagles"

Marine Fighter Squadron 1115 was organized on 1 July 1943 at Santa Barbara, Calif., under the command of Maj. John S. MacLaughlin. Sixteen days later, the command was assumed by one of the Marine Corps' most famous Aces, Maj. Joseph Foss, holder of a Marine World War II record of twenty-six enemy aircraft shot down. The squadron quickly picked up the nickname, "Joe's Jokers." In May 1944, the squadron joined the Pacific campaign flying the legendary F4U-1 Corsair.

At the conclusion of World War II, the squadron deployed to Peking, China,



to protect U.S. interests in that area and support III Marine Amphibious Corps supervising the surrender and repatriation of 630,000 Japanese troops and civilians in North China.

In December 1949, VMF-115 became the first Marine Corps squadron to receive a full complement of Grumman F9F-2 Panther jet fighters and during November 1950, was the first to serve aboard a carrier, qualifying all 18 pilots without incident aboard the USS Roosevelt.

In the spring of 1957, the squadron received the Marine Corps' first F-40 Skyrays and were designated VMF(AW)-115. After flying Skyrays longer than any other squadron, VMF(AW)-115 was redesignated VMFA-115 on 1 January 1964 and transitioned to the Mach II capable F-4B Phantom II.

The "Able Eagles" were deployed to Da Nang, Republic of Vietnam on 14 October 1965.

During the Vietnam War, VMFA-115 flew more than 34,000 combat sorties, at a cost of 14 aircraft lost, 21 aircrew killed in action, and six Marines killed in action while participating in such battles as the Tet Offensive, Hue City, Khe San, and Task Force Delta.

In July 1977, VMFA-115 relocated to 2d MAW, MCAS Beaufort, SC.

After flying Phantoms for more than 20 years, VMFA-115 began the transition to the F/A-18A Hornet on 1 January 1985, and officially stood up with 14 aircraft on 16 August 1985. The following year, the squadron became officially known as the "Silver Eagles."

In 1989, VMFA-115 returned to the Philippines and supported government forces during a coup attempt in that country. The squadron flew armed CAP and escort missions until the situation stabilized.

During the years from 1991 to 2000, the "Silver Eagles" participated in the Unit Deployment Program (UDP) in the Western Pacific for six-month deployments in support of 1st MAW. Upon completion of their 2000 UDP, the "Silver Eagles" began the transition from F/A-18As to the updated F/A-18A+s. As of spring 2001, VMFA-115 was designated a carrier integration squadron. The Marines of VMFA-115 deployed aboard the USS Truman as part of Carrier Air Wing 3 in the fall of 2002; this was the first carrier deployment for the "Silver



Eagles" since 1981 when they flew F-4s. This deployment was in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom in which the squadron expended more than 150 tons of ordnance.

The illustrious history of Marine Corps aviation has been highlighted with the outstanding achievement of VMFA-115. The squadron has seen extensive service in nearly every war involving Marines. During those years, it carried out its assigned missions with distinction in the South Pacific, the Philippines, North China, Korea, Taiwan, Vietnam and Thailand. In peacetime training, whether in Japan, the United States, Hawaii, Okinawa, the Caribbean, the Mediterranean, or Western Europe, VMFA-115 set a standard of excellence for other Fighter-Attack squadrons in the Marine Corps to follow.

The Silver Eagles returned in early 2007 from a six month deployment to Iwakuni, Japan supporting training requirements in Japan and South Korea.

VMFA-122

"The Crusaders"

Marine Fighter Squadron 122 was commissioned on 1 March 1942 at Camp Kearny, California. Originally the "Candy-stripers," the squadron was organized and trained under its first Commanding Officer, Major I.I. Brackett. Outfitted with the F-4F "Wildcat,"

the squadron embarked on its first combat tour in October 1942. Throughout 1942-43, the squadron conducted combat operations on Espiritu Santo, at Henderson Field, Guadalcanal, and during the Rendova and Munda campaigns. During April 1943, under the command of Major "Pappy" Boyington, VMF-122 transitioned to the F4U-1 "Corsair," and accounted for 351/2 kills. The squadron ended its first combat tour, returning to Miramar, California, in August 1943.

Embarking on the USS Hollandia for its second combat deployment during July 1944, the squadron was outfitted with new Goodyear F4G-1A aircraft.

The squadron remained at Peleliu until reporting to MCAS Cherry Point, North Carolina in February 1946. Deactivated between July and October 1946, VMF-122 was reactivated and received the FH-1 "Phantom" in November 1947, becoming the first Marine Squadron to employ jet-propelled aircraft. Assigned to USS Oriskany, VMF-122 became the first Marine jet squadron to be both day and night qualified for carrier operations. In July 1952, the squadron transitioned to the F9F-4 "Panther." Later equipped with the more powerful F9F-5 the squadron deployed aboard the USS Coral Sea. Following the Mediterranean Sea cruise in 1953, the squadron was assigned to MAG-24 at MCAS Cherry Point, North Carolina.



In January 1954, VMF-122 was the first Marine Squadron equipped with the FJ-2 "Fury." With a change of aircraft, the squadron adopted the distinctive Candystriper insignia and tail markings. VMF-122 relocated to MCAS Beaufort, SC in September 1957. In December 1957 the squadron became the fastest squadron in the Marine Corps with delivery of the first F8U-1's (F-8A) "Crusader" by Chance-Vought. A new patch was designed to go with the new aircraft and VMF-122 officially became known as the "Crusaders".

During 1964, the Crusaders deployed to Atsugi, Japan, for one year, returning to MCAS El Toro, California in January 1965. At El Toro, VMF(AW)-122 transitioned to the F-4B "Phantom" and was designated Marine Fighter Attack Squadron 122. VMFA-122 deployed to the Republic of Vietnam in August 1967, operating from Da Nang Air Base. VMFA-122 rotated to MCAS Iwakuni, Japan in September 1968, returning to Vietnam in the summer of 1969, at Marine Air Base Chu Lai.

Following a distinguished combat record, the "Crusaders" were assigned to MCAS Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii, in September

1970. The "Crusaders" were then ordered to MCAS Iwakuni, Japan, as a Joint Chiefs of Staff directive to counter a North Vietnamese offensive against South Vietnam. The squadron returned to Kaneohe Bay, Hawaii on 27 December 1972.

On 14 August 1974, VMFA-122 was placed in a Cadre status in anticipation of becoming the Marine Corps' first F-14A squadron. With the decision not to accept the "Tomcat" into the Marine Corps inventory, VMFA-122 was reactivated at MCAS Beaufort, S.C. and refitted with the F-4J. On 25 September 1985, VMFA-122 flew its last F-4 sortie, completing 20 years of service as a F-4 "Phantom" squadron.

On 22 January 1986, the "Crusaders" began a new era with the acceptance of its first F/A-18A Hornet. In October 2001, the "Crusaders" increased their combat capabilities by transitioning to the F/A-18C. In July 2002, the "Crusaders" continued the UDP rotation, deploying to Iwakuni, Japan, in which the squadron was extended for a full year. While on deployment in November of 2002 the "Crusaders" surpassed 70,000 Class A mishap-free flight hours. In Feb. 2004 the squadron deployed for a Western Pacific tour for 6 months.

The Crusaders returned in early 2007 from a six month deployment to Iwakuni, Japan supporting training requirements in Japan and South Korea.

VMFA(AW)-224

"The Bengals"

Marine Fighter Squadron (VMF) 224 was commissioned on 1 May 1942 at Barbers Point Hawaii. Flying Grumman F-4F Wildcats, the Bengals entered WWII as part of the vaunted Cactus Air Force stationed on Henderson Field Guadalcanal. Led by Medal of Honor recipient Maj Robert Galer, in less than 2 months the squadron accounted for over 60 downed Japanese aircraft and conducted infantry support missions while under constant attack from Japanese Naval, Air, and Ground forces. The American victory at Guadalcanal helped stem the tide of the Japanese advance across the Southern Pacific and secured a crucial foothold in the long island hopping campaign to Japan.

Following the surrender of Japan, the squadron served in various capacities in

the states and overseas. The squadron entered the jet era in 1951 with the acceptance of the F2H-2 Banshee. In 1952, after completing a Mediterranean Cruise aboard the USS Roosevelt, the squadron accepted the Grumman F9F-5 Panther, and was redesignated Marine Attack Squadron (VMA) 224. In July 1956, the squadron became the first Marine unit to field the A4D-1 Skyhawk aircraft.

On 1 November 1966 the squadron acquired the Grumman A-6A Intruder and was redesignated as Marine All-Weather Attack Squadron 224.

The squadron received the upgraded A-6E TRAM (Target Recognition and Multi-Sensor) aircraft in 1974.

The Bengals deployed to the Middle East arriving on 28 August 1990. Operating from Shaikh-Isa Air Base, Bahrain the squadron conducted deterrent and training sorties as part of operation Desert Shield. From 16 January to 28 February 1991, the Bengals led the way in night combat operations in support of Operation Desert Storm, expending more than 2.3 million pounds of ordnance during 422 combat sorties.

On 6 March 1993 the squadron was redesignated VMFA(AW)-224 and moved to MCAS Beaufort, S.C. where the Bengals received the multi-mission F/A-18D Hornet.

In September 1994, September 1995, and February 1997, the Bengals deployed to Aviano, Italy, as part of the United Nations force for operations Deny Flight, Provide Promise, Deliberate Force, Joint Endeavor, Deliberate Guard, and Silver Wake.

In July of 2001, VMFA(AW)-224 for UDP in the Far East. For a majority of the deployment the squadron was split into two detachments. The detachments flew in support of both 31st MEU and 15th MEU, conducted ATARS reconnaissance missions, normal squadron training, and other such operations as deemed necessary by 1st MAF and MAG-12. During the course of the UDP, the Bengals operated out of Guam, Okinawa, Australia, Truk Island, Pappa New Guinea, the Philippines Islands, South Korea, and mainland Japan.

In July of 2003 VMFA(AW)-224 deployed again for UDP in the Far East. The unit operated out of Darwin, Australia; Okinawa; Guam in support of Exercise Cope North; and Iwakuni, Japan.



In Feb. 2005, the unit was the first MAG-31 squadron to deploy in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. The unit returned in Aug. 2005 after completing a successful combat deployment at Camp Al Asad, Iraq. The squadron boasts an impressive record of sorties flown and delivery of ordinance in support of operations on the ground. In 2007 the Bengals will deploy to Iwakuni, Japan as part of the Unit Deployment Program.

VMFA-251

"The Thunderbolts"

Marine Fighter Squadron 251 was activated 1 December 1941 at Naval Air Station North Island, California as Marine Observation Squadron 251 (VMO-251) under the command of Capt Elliot E. Bard.

While flying the Grumman F4F-3P "Wildcat" during World War II, the squadron participated in numerous Pacific campaigns including Guadalcanal, Solomon Islands, Santa Cruz, Luzon, and the Southern Philippines. In July 1942, the squadron deployed to New Zealand and was then relocated to the island of Espiritu Santo to support the invasion of Guadalcanal. The squadron returned to the United States in July 1943.

Following a move to Mojave, California, in May 1943 and then to Camp

Pendleton, California in November of that same year, the squadron transitioned to the Vought F-4U "Corsair" and was redesignated as Marine Fighting Squadron 251. The squadron was redeployed to Espiritu Santo in February 1944 with the new motto "Lucifer's Messenger." While on Espiritu Santo, the squadron participated in an offensive push on the Japanese Fortress of Rabaul until January 1944. The Thunderbolts then relocated to the Central Philippines and again to Bougainville in June to participate in the Bismark Sea campaign before returning to the Philippines in January 1945. VMF-251 continued operations in the Pacific until 1 May 1945 when it flew its last combat mission of World War II while supporting clean-up operations at Leyte.

In May 1994, VMFA-251 received F/A-18Cs in preparation for assignment to Carrier Air Wing One aboard the USS America. The Thunderbolts successfully completed their first carrier deployment with the F/A-18C in February 1996. The Thunderbolts deployed two additional times with CVW-1, aboard the USS George Washington in September 1997 and the USS John F. Kennedy in September 1999. Both deployments were in support of Operation Southern Watch.

During the summer months of 2001 the squadron completed another workup

cycle with CVW-1. In September 2001, the squadron deployed onboard the USS Theodore Roosevelt to the Arabian Sea where it was the first Marine squadron to participate in Operation Enduring Freedom. The squadron returned to MCAS Beaufort, South Carolina in March 2002.

In September 2002, the Thunderbolts were presented the Robert Hanson Trophy as the "Marine Fighter Attack Squadron of the Year."

On 12 February 2003, the squadron detached from MAG-31 and departed on an unscheduled deployment with MAG-11 to the Middle East in support of Operation Southern Watch and then Operation Iraqi Freedom. On 20 February 2003, the squadron began flying combat missions in support of OSW and then transitioned to combat operations in support of OIF on 19 March 2003.

The squadron flew its last OIF mission on 4 May 2003 and returned home to MAG-31 on 13 May 2003. They deployed again aboard the USS Enterprise from April 2006 to October 2006 and flew missions in support of both Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom. This deployment marked the first time that, as a carrier based squadron, the unit deployed ashore to Camp Al Asad, Iraq for two months before embarking back on the USS Enterprise.



VMFA-312

"The Checkerboards"

Marine Fighter Squadron 312 (VMF-312) was commissioned on 1 June 1943 at Page Field, Parris Island, South Carolina. Commanded by Major Richard M. Day, the squadron began flight operations with 10 North American SNJ-4 Texans and one F4U-1D's and one SNJ-4. The squadron began combat training due to the urgency of the war effort. At this time, the Checkerboards emblem began to appear on both the cowling and rudder of the aircraft. Sporting six .50 caliber machine guns, the design continues to adorn the identifier of VMFA-312.

Departing Parris Island on 2 January 1944, the squadron prepared to begin combat operations in the Pacific theater assigned to Marine Aircraft Group 11 on 25 June 1944, the squadron was transported to Espiritu Santo, New Hebrides, where they received 24 Goodyear FG-1 Corsairs. With newly installed 3.5 and 5 inch rocket launchers, the squadron prepared for its first combat action from the recently captured Kadena airstrip. VMF-312 continued to operate from Kadena Air Base until the cessation of hostilities.

In 1973, the squadron received the newer F-4J aircraft, with its much improved radar and avionics, as well as improved aerodynamic design.

In 1979, the Checkerboards became the first Second Marine Aircraft Wing Fighter Squadron to deploy to WES-PAC under the Unit Deployment six-month rotation program. In July 1987, VMFA-312

retired its F-4 aircraft and transitioned to the F/A-18A Hornet. In August, transitioned to the F/A-18C Night Attack Hornet.

In April of 2000, VMFA-312 began cruise workups with Carrier Air Wing Three; however, this time the ship was the USS Harry S. Truman sailing on her maiden deployment. On November 27, VMFA-312 embarked on the USS Harry S. Truman for her historic first deployment.

Carrier Air Wing Three entered the North Arabian Gulf and began Operation Southern Watch missions on January 3, 2001. On January 20th, a VMFA-312 jet destroyed an anti-aircraft artillery site, which was threatening coalition aircraft in Southern Iraq. On February 16th, five VMFA-312 aircraft participated in a large force strike against numerous targets in the vicinity of Baghdad.

The Checkerboards deployed aboard the USS Enterprise in August of 2003. They flew combat sorties in support of Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom. In November 2003 it was the first squadron in Carrier Air Wing One to release ordnance in support of ground forces in Iraq. The Checkerboards remained in the Central Command Area of Responsibility until the end of January and returned home to Beaufort in February of 2004. The squadron was awarded the 2004 Marine Corps Aviation Association Hanson Award, as the best Fighter Attack squadron in the Marine Corps. The squadron continues to train and prepare to support the Global War on Terror. They deployed to Iwakuni, Japan in mid 2006.

VMFA(AW)-332

"The Moonlighters"

Marine All-Weather Fighter Attack Squadron 332 was first commissioned in June 1943 at the newly constructed Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, North Carolina. Originally designated as Marine Scout Bomber Squadron (VMSB-332), the squadron flew SBD Dauntless dive-bombers out of Cherry Point and Bougue Field, North Carolina and Mojave, California before departing for the Pacific Theatre during World War II. On 1 March 1945, the squadron would make the first of four changes in squadron designations. Redesignated Marine Torpedo Bombing Squadron 332 (VTMB-332), the squadron transitioned to the TBM Avenger. After the war, 332 relocated to San Diego in November 1945 for deactivation.

Marine Attack Squadron 332 was recommissioned on 23 April 1952 as part of 3d Marine Aircraft Wing at MCAS Opa Locka, Florida, flying the F6F Hell Cat and later F4U Corsairs. During the Korean conflict, Marine Attack Squadron 332 was assigned a combat role operating from the USS Bairoko, distinguishing themselves as one of the few Marine squadrons flying from an aircraft carrier.

Upon return from the war in 1953, VMA-332 transitioned to the AD-1 Skyraider. From 1953 to 1957, VMA-332 rotated annually between the East Coast and the Far East. In 1958, the squadron relocated back to MCAS Cherry Point, North Carolina, and entered the jet age transitioning to the venerable A-4D Skyhawk.

VMA-332 continued its yearly rotation to Japan until 1962, when it was deployed to Udorn, Thailand, to support a Marine Expeditionary Force quelling unrest in that country. Later in 1962, the squadron would deploy back home. It was during this time that the squadron's nickname was mysteriously changed to the "Moonlighters" and the tail letters were changed to "EA." Although there are speculations, no written explanation exists for the change.

On 20 August 1968, the "Moonlighters" transitioned to the A-6 Intruder and was designated Marine All-Weather Attack Squadron 332. On 1 March 1975, the squadron received its first A-6E Intruder and in July 1982, they again upgraded to the A-6E TRAM (Target Recognition and Attack Multi-sensor).



16 June 1993, began a new chapter for the "Moonlighters" when the squadron was re-designated Marine All-Weather Fighter Attack Squadron 332, moved to MCAS Beaufort, South Carolina, and transitioned to the F/A-18D Hornet. Having to ramp up rapidly as a "new" squadron, the "Moonlighters" were called on to support NATO's Operations Deny Flight and Provide Promise in the former Yugoslavian republic of Bosnia from Aviano Air Base, Italy from October 1994 to March 1995. During the deployment, the squadron led what was the largest NATO air strike to date against the Udbina Airfield as well as participating in several other strikes. In July 2005 the squadron departed MCAS Beaufort for its combat deployment in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. During its seven months of combat operations that included the Iraqi Constitutional Referendum and National Elections, the squadron flew many other operations in support of war fighters in the Al Anbar Province. During this deployment the Moonlighters flew 2,406 sorties for a total of 6,031 combat flight hours.

On 1 March 2000, the "Moonlighters" reached the milestone 81,000 mishap free flight hours, a safety record spanning 21 years. The "Moonlighters" have now surpassed 100,000 hours. This is the first fighter attack squadron in Corps to achieve this milestone. As part of the Marine Aviation Transition Strategy, the Moonlighters are scheduled to deactivate in March 2007.

Unit Honors include the Meritorious Unit Commendation with two Bronze Stars, the Navy Unit Commendation, the Asian-Pacific Campaign Streamer, the World War II Victory Streamer, the Korean Service Streamer with one Bronze Star, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Streamer, and the National Defense Streamer with two Bronze Stars. The unit returned in March 2006 after completing a successful combat deployment at Camp Al Asad, Iraq. The squadron boasts an impressive record of sorties flown and delivery of ordnance in support of operations on the ground. As previously stated, as part of the Marine Aviation Transition Strategy, the unit will deactivate in 2007.

VMFA(AW)-533

"The Hawks"

Marine Fighter Squadron 533 began an illustrious tradition of tactical excellence



on 1 October 1943 at Cherry Point, North Carolina. Commissioned as Marine Night Fighter Squadron-533 (VMF(N)-533), it was the third such Marine Squadron, which flew the Grumman F6F-3N Hellcat.

In October 1945, 533 was stationed in Peiping, China and soon transitioned to the F7F-3N Tigercat. From Peiping the squadron moved to Hawaii, and in January 1947 to MCAS Cherry Point, N.C., where during the Korean conflict the squadron trained aircrews for the night fighter squadrons in Korea.

In May 1953, the squadron transitioned to its first jet aircraft, the F2H-A Banshee. The squadron was re-designated as Marine Fighter Squadron 533. The F9F-9 Cougar was introduced to the Hawks in 1957. A-4D's replaced the Cougars and the squadron was re-designated Marine Attack Squadron 533 in 1959. In 1965, Marine Attack Squadron 533 became Marine All Weather Attack Squadron after acquiring the world's most sophisticated attack aircraft, at the time, the Grumman A-6A Intruder. In June 1972, VMA(AW)-533 returned to combat while deployed to Nam Phong, Thailand, otherwise known as the "Rose Garden." The squadron returned to MCAS Iwakuni in August 1973. In November 1975 the squadron departed for MCAS Cherry Point. In 1976 VMA(AW)-533 received its first Marine A-6E aircraft.

During December 1990, the squadron completed the movement of ten A-6E Intruders to NAS Cubi Point, Philippines in preparation for deployment to

Operation Desert Shield. From 23 December 1990 to 16 January 1991, the Hawks conducted flight operations and 24-hour CAS/DAS alerts in support of Operation Desert Shield.

On 24 March 1991, the squadron returned to MCAS Cherry Point, completing an eleven and one-half month around the world tour. The Hawks made history on 1 September 1992 when they were re-designated Marine All Weather Fighter Attack Squadron 533, becoming the first squadron in 2nd Marine Aircraft Wing to transition to the two-seat F/A-18D. The squadron received its first F/A-18D on 7 October 1992 and completed relocation to MCAS Beaufort, SC on 7 December 1992. In July 1993, VMFA(AW)-533 deployed to Aviano Air Base, Italy, in support of NATO forces and Security Council resolution 816. The Hawks flew their first operational mission over Bosnia-Herzegovina only three days after setting foot on Italian soil. The squadron returned to the United States on 14 January 1994.

On 23 March 1995, VMFA(AW)-533 redeployed to Aviano, Italy, in support of Operation Deny Flight. On 8 June 1995, a division of Hawks located and assisted in the rescue of Air Force Captain Scott O'Grady. In August 1996, VMFA(AW)-533 redeployed to Aviano Air Base, Italy, in support of Operations Decisive Edge and Joint Endeavor. The Hawks returned to MCAS Beaufort on 22 February 1997.

On 31 August 1998, VMFA(AW)-533 left MCAS Beaufort for its first WestPac

Deployment in seven years. On 28 May, the Hawks led the first strike into Yugoslavia, destroying multiple military storage facilities north of Pristina. After spending nine out of the previous eleven months deployed, the Hawks returned to MCAS Beaufort on 2 July 1999.

Departing Beaufort on 10 February 2003 in support of Operations Southern Watch and Enduring Freedom and arriving at Ahmed Al Jaber Air Base, Kuwait on 11 February 2003, the Hawks once again found themselves poised for combat. On 20 March 2003, coalition forces crossed into Iraq and for the next 30 days conducted 24-hour flight operations in support of the coalition forces' advance into Iraq. With the end of hostilities in mid-April of 2003 the Hawks were subsequently ordered to prepare for redeployment to CONUS. Leaving the sandstorms of Kuwait behind, the squadron began their retrograde on 02 May 2003 and had safely returned every member of the squadron to Beaufort by 10 May 2003. The squadron is currently preparing for an early deployment to Iraq. The unit returned in September 2006 after completing a successful combat deployment to Camp Al Asad, Iraq.

Navy Strike Fighter Squadron

VFA-86

"The Sidewinders"

Strike Fighter Squadron EIGHT SIX traces its origin to Fighter Squadron 921, based at Naval Air Station St. Louis,

M.O., during the Korean War in February 1951. In February 1953, the squadron was redesignated VF-84 while deployed to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba aboard USS Antietam. In July 1955, the squadron was redesignated VA-86 Sidewinders.

When originally commissioned the squadron flew the F4U "Corsair." In June 1953, the squadron commenced training in the F8F-2 "Bearcat" in preparation for flying the F9F-5 "Panther," which it began flying in November 1953. In April 1955, the squadron began transitioning to the F7U-3M "Cutlass" or, as it was affectionately called, "The Ensign Eater." Following extensive evaluation work with the Sparrow I missile, VA-86 retired their "Cutlasses" for the A4D-1 "Skyhawk" in May 1957. After almost 10 years in the "Skyhawk," VA-86 began transition to the A-7A "Corsair II" in March 1967 and became the first fleet operational squadron of A-7's in the Navy on 1 June 1967. On 15 July 1987, Attack Squadron Eighty-six was redesignated Strike Fighter Squadron Eighty-six and began transitioning to the FA-18C Hornet.

The Sidewinders took part in many major conflicts to include the Korean War, four combat deployments to Vietnam, "Desert Storm," Operations "Deny Flight" and "Deliberate Force" off the coast of Bosnia, Operation Enduring Freedom in Afghanistan, and Operation Iraqi Freedom. While flying over Afghanistan in 2001-2002, starting just days after the New York City terror acts, the squadron delivered over 425,000 pounds of ordnance and flew over 3,100 hours in less than three

months of combat operations aboard USS Theodore Roosevelt. The squadron was recognized throughout the deployment for both operational and maintenance achievements. During OIF, in 2003-2004, the squadron flew over 3000 flight hours over Iraq over the six-month deployment bagging over 1600 traps aboard USS Enterprise. The squadron deployed again aboard the USS Enterprise from April 2006 to October 2006 and flew missions in support of both Operations Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom.

Marine Wing Support Squadron 273

"The Sweat Hogs"

On June 13, 1986, Marine Wing Support Squadron 273 (MWSS 273) was formed at Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort, South Carolina, from elements of Marine Air Base Squadron 31, and Detachment Bravo, Marine Wing Support Group 27. The assigned mission of MWSS 273 is to provide all essential aviation ground support to a designated fixed-wing component of a Marine Aviation Combat Element (ACE), and all supporting or attached elements of the Marine Air Control Group (MACG). This support includes internal airfield communications, weather services, expeditionary airfield services, aircraft rescue and firefighting, aircraft and ground refueling, essential engineer services, motor transport, messing, chemical defense, security and law enforcement, airbase commandant functions, and explosive ordnance disposal.



Additionally, in garrison, MWSS 273 is tasked to supplement air station facilities and services provided by Marine Corps Air Station Beaufort, SC.

Since the formation of the Squadron, the "Sweat Hogs" of MWSS 273 have distinguished themselves tactically and professionally in the continental United States and around the world. In 1989, MWSS 273 provided extensive disaster relief support to the city of Charleston, SC, during the aftermath of Hurricane Hugo. During Operation Desert Storm in 1990, the squadron played a direct role in providing aviation ground support for United Nations forces conducting combat operations against Iraq. During Operation Desert Storm, the Marines of MWSS 273 assisted in the construction of the largest expeditionary airfield in Marine Corps history at Al Khanjar, Saudi Arabia, in addition to several other major construction and transportation projects. Throughout the 1990's, the squadron provided extensive operational support to Aviano Air Force Base, Italy, Nato contingency operations Deny Flight and Provide Promise, Operation Uphold Democracy in Haiti, Operation Joint Forge in the Balkans, Operation Allied Force and Joint Task Force Noble Anvil in Tazsar, Hungary, and numerous Marine Expeditionary Units. In addition to MWSS-273 has also provided extensive training and exercise support both in and out of CONUS, to include, Baltic Challenge, Baltic Castle, Roving Sands, Combined Arms Exercises (CAX), Hornet's Nest, Battle Griffin, Fuertes Defenses, Dynamic Mix, Joint Task Force-6, and New Horizons.

MWSS-273 has extended its impressive record into the new millennium, providing support personnel for the ongoing Operation Enduring Freedom taking place in Afghanistan, Operation Iraqi Freedom and joint Task Force-Bravo in the Republic of Honduras, and exercises CAX, Desert Talon and New Horizons. These operations and exercises have continuously challenged the abilities and dedication of the squadron throughout its history, yielding consistently stellar results.

In addition to its tactical competence and success, MWSS-273 has consistently provided support for military and civic construction projects, saving taxpayers millions of dollars.

Major projects completed by the Sweat Hogs include: The Marine Corps Recruit Depot, Parris Island's "Crucible" and



several physical fitness areas, the Summerville, S.C., parks and recreation athletic complex, St. Helena's Island tornado clean-up and erosion control at Hunting Island State Park and hurricane evacuation and clean-up assistance. Since 1997, MWSS-273 has taken the lead, Marine Corps wide, in K-Span construction, completing over 20 buildings in five years, including eleven K-Spans for MCGCDC 29 Palms, six K-Spans for MCAS, Beaufort, two K-Spans for MCRD PI, and one K-Span for the local community.

Unit Awards include the Navy Commendation Streamer, the National Defense Service Streamer, and the Southwest Asia Streamer with three bronze stars.

History of Naval Hospital Beaufort

Naval Hospital Beaufort opened in 1949 on 127 acres, of historic land. Since

1966, Naval Hospital Beaufort has administered the TRICARE Program, the Department of Defense's managed health care program for active duty members, military, families and retirees.

Beaufort, South Carolina

Welcome

Beaufort is a city of traditional gracious beauty and character. Striking pre-Revolutionary and Civil War mansions are found in the city and placid and productive marshes teeming with life and broad rivers roll down to the great sounds. It is a city of antiquity and pride, where family roots and accomplishments count a great deal more than material aspects of life.

One of the first areas in America to be visited by European explorers, it has known Spanish conquistadors, French Huguenot colonists, English privateers and pirates, Scottish fur traders, Indian wars and bloody fighting during the Revolutionary War. It was the center of culture and affluence prior to the Civil War when great fortunes were made first in the cultivation of rice and indigo and later in long staple sea cotton.

The South Carolina historian McCraddy wrote that the plantation owners in this area, who had summer homes in Beaufort, made that city, "one of the wealthiest, most aristocratic and cultivated towns of its size in America."

It was also a hotbed of secessionist sentiment and the original Ordinance of Secession was drawn up in Beaufort. South Carolina led the withdrawal of the southern states from the rest of America and as a result, Beaufort was made an early objective for recapture by the U.S. government.

The Federal forces launched an attack from the sea in November 1861 and brushed aside the weak and incomplete Confederate defenses. Beaufort was occupied for the next several years and many homes were sold for as little as \$15 in back taxes. For years the economic desolation resulting from the war left the county without any viable industry. Later, Phosphate mining and a U.S. Naval base were the only sources of revenue.

After World War II in particular, it was discovered that this area was one of the last undeveloped and unpolluted areas on the East Coast.

A residential boom began at locations around Beaufort, which attracted industry to the area, and the county population grew accordingly.

Shopping Centers/ Newspapers & Magazines

There are numerous shopping centers, banks and savings and loans in the area. The local paper is *The Beaufort Gazette*. Also available are *The Island Packet*; *The State*; *Charleston Post and Courier*; *Bluffton Today*; *USA Today*, *The Gullah Sentinel* and *News Piedmont*.

Transportation

Beaufort is mainly dependent upon the automobile. Major highways within the region include Interstate 95 and U.S. Highways 17, 21, 170 and 278. I-95, the main north-south corridor on the East Coast, extends from Maine to Miami, Florida, carrying an average of more than 16,000 vehicles per day through lower South Carolina, and connects with all other eastern interstates. Easy access is provided at Exit 33 to other major highways: U.S. Highway 17, the coastal route to the ports of Charleston and Savannah, U.S. Highway 278 to the towns of Bluffton and Hilton Head Island, and U.S. Highway 170 and 21 to the city of Beaufort and town of Port Royal. A number of significant improvement projects for the Beaufort regional highway system have begun and other improvement projects are proposed for the Beaufort County Transportation Program. Other types of transportation compliment the roadways.

Buses: The Lowcountry Regional Transportation Authority provides public bus transportation for the general public. For bus route schedules and fares, which varies with type of transportation, call the executive director at 1-888-757-5782. The Greyhound Bus Lines serve the low country area with tickets for distant traveling; 1307 Boundary St., (843) 524-4646.

Taxi Service: Independent cab companies operate taxis in Beaufort County. Beaufort County taxi fares are regulated by the City Council.

Rail: Trains leaving out of Yemassee, S.C. (approximately 25 miles north) is the only passenger train running through the Lowcountry. For prices and schedules call Amtrak at 1-800-835-8725.

Air Service: Beaufort County has two county-owned airports; one on Lady's Island and the other on Hilton Head Island. Federal funding, coupled with local county and state expenditures, has resulted in many recent improvements to both airports. The Beaufort County Airport (Frogmore International) is located on U.S. Highway 21, four miles from downtown Beaufort. This airport has a 3,430-foot runway, radio-controlled runway lights, and a dawn to dusk terminal, including fuel availability and limited services and increased civil aviation capacity. The runway was extended to 5,000 feet, allowing up to 50 passenger planes, an increase from the current limit of 30-passenger planes. Airline service is available at Savannah Airport (55 miles south of Beaufort on Georgia 307) and Charleston Airport (75 miles north of Beaufort on Interstate 526) with regularly scheduled airline service, as well as airfreight.

TV and Radio

There are 13 radio and seven TV stations that serve the Lowcountry.

Port Royal, South Carolina Welcome

Both Parris Island and the Naval Hospital's closest neighboring community is the town of Port Royal. Located just outside the main gate of each installation and on both sides of Battery Creek, Port Royal is the home of many federal employees, both military and civilian. While much emphasis is placed these days on being new and improved, Port Royal has positioned itself as a traditional neighborhood community that believes in doing it "the old fashioned way."

Charm and a sense of history combine to make this a town whose roots are firmly planted in the settlements of the early 1500s when the Spanish explorer Pedro de Quexos first set foot on Port Royal. The first English settlers arrived in 1670 and permanent settlers made Port Royal home in 1711. Early in the 1900s, Port Royal was the stopping point for Marine Recruits bound for Parris Island. At the port of Port Royal, recruits departed trains, boarded vessels and sailed across the Beaufort River to Parris Island where their training commenced.



Today, Port Royal is preserving its Southern past while moving forward into the 21st century. The town core is being revitalized promoting walking neighborhoods where families interact with one another in a friendly, casual lifestyle. Many new homes in the core district of town have been built close to each other incorporating back alleyways to encourage a sense of neighborliness. One community even includes a porch swing with each house they sell. Various home developments have been strategically placed in and around pleasant vistas and curious attractions.

Town planners have in recent years incorporated wide sidewalks to encourage early evening walks and foster a diminishing dependence on automobiles. Walking trails and parks located throughout provide for leisurely recreation. For in-line skaters, Live Oak Park on Paris Avenue offers a roller hockey rink. Located near downtown Port Royal is "The Sands" which is the site of the annual July 4th celebration and fireworks display. A favorite spot for many residents, The Sands provides a scenic view of the Beaufort River in a beach-type setting. The commercial district

has been encouraged to develop near the residential areas to allow quick and easy access to restaurants, shops and other amenities without getting into the car and driving. The colony soon expanded into a busy, successful maritime and agricultural community, playing a significant role in the Nation's founding. The name was changed to Charleston in 1783. Today the Charleston metro area continues to grow and flourish, yet maintains its rich, historic charm. The region stretches from central to southern South Carolina, some 50 miles inland, with 90 miles of ocean-front. The area's economic mix is diverse, combining the largest containerized cargo port on the South Atlantic and Gulf coasts.

Hurricane History

Hurricane season for the Atlantic coast begins June 1 and will continue through Nov. 30. Beaufort has been fortunate and missed the brunt of several severe storms in the past few years. However the danger of a major hurricane coming ashore here remains.

For newcomers to the area since Hurricane Hugo, it is hard to comprehend the force of the storm and the damage it inflicted upon the Lowcountry. For others who braved the deluge of rain, high winds and vivid lightning, Sept 21, 1989, is a date difficult to forget.

While Beaufort County sustained only minor wind damage and heavy rainfall, Charleston, along with its surrounding communities of Summerville and McClenanville, were nearly leveled by one of the most devastating hurricanes to ever hit the Southeastern United States.

Even as Hugo methodically approached the Atlantic Coast leaving behind a wake of destruction throughout the Bahamas and Puerto Rico, many believed the storm would weaken. Instead, Hugo gathered strength and headed for South Carolina and Georgia coastline.

Only when landfall was imminent did residents begin to brace for the storm. As a result, many were ill prepared for what became a catastrophe. Thousands of people evacuated coastal areas in the waning moments before the storm's landfall. Hugo even forced the cancellation of Company H, 2nd Battalion's recruit graduation ceremony.

Beaufort was also spared the damage of Hurricane Bob in 1991 as it took a northward swing and made landfall in the Camp Lejeune, N.C., area.

Hurricane Advisory

Most recently and perhaps the most powerful storm to hit the Southeast in the last century was Hurricane Katrina in 2005. The storm destroyed Homestead Air Force Base, Fla., and leveled much of the southern portion of the state and then moved into the Gulf of Mexico to do the same to Louisiana.

Two strong hurricanes hit the Gulf Coast near Pensacola, Fla., in 1995. Their effects are still being felt as property owners struggle to rebuild their homes and their lives.

In 1996, Hurricane Bertha and Fran approached the low country, but both diverted north to the Camp Lejeune region. In 2000, Hurricane Floyd became less of a threat to the area as it weakened and became a tropical storm.

If there is a bright spot which shines through the destruction, it would have to be the heightened sense of awareness Atlantic Coast residents now have. These storms have enlightened many about a hurricane's deadly force and how best to prepare themselves and their property against it.

Hurricane Planning

Advanced technology and satellite imagery have greatly enhanced meteorologists' ability to detect hurricanes and the probable paths they will take.

Early detection ensures the safety of thousands of residents along the Atlantic Coast, allowing them ample time to prepare for an advancing storm.

When a hurricane watch is issued for the Lowcountry, a threat of a hurricane-making landfall is possible. Hurricane conditions include winds in excess of 74 mph and dangerously high tides and waves.

The following actions should immediately be taken under a hurricane watch or warning to protect your life and property:

- Regularly monitor weather reports on the radio or television. Pay attention to official announcements—not to rumors.
- Find out what you need to do for proof of claim or loss and how to process a claim following the storm.
- Store enough food and water in a safe place to last each person three to five

days. Store food that doesn't require refrigeration and turn down the refrigerator to its lowest setting so food will keep longer if power is lost. Keep extra water in a clean bathtub or other containers. Use a barbecue grill or camping stove to cook, and store paper cups, plates and plastic silverware.

- Keep two to three changes of clothes per person.
- Gather tools and materials to help protect your home such as shutters or boards, nails, tape, hammers, shovel, etc.
- Secure the outside of your home by putting away toys, lawn furniture, etc., and anchoring all objects that are too big to be brought inside. Protect glass by boarding, securing shutters or taping windows and brace garage doors.
- Do not drain swimming pools.
- Fill your automobile's gas tank in case evacuation becomes necessary.
- Fill needed prescriptions and ensure a fully stocked first aid kit is available.
- Make arrangements for pets in case of evacuation. Pets are not allowed in any public shelters.
- Secure your boat in a safe harbor. Boats on trailers should be moved into a garage or properly secured outside.
- Check your supplies making sure you have a working flashlight and radio with an adequate stock of batteries.
- Move all valuables upstairs if flooding may occur and store valuable documents in water proof containers.
- If evacuation becomes necessary, leave as soon as possible. Know where you are going using only recommended travel routes and do not take shortcuts, coastal roads or drive through flood waters.
- Use the telephone only for emergencies.

Remain calm. If evacuation becomes necessary, ensure the following actions are taken prior to leaving home:

- Turn off all utilities including gas, electricity and water. Lock all windows and doors.
- Post a message regarding where you're going and who is with you.
- Take important supplies such as a first aid kit, cash food and water, medicines, important documents, sleeping bags or blankets, baby food and supplies, a flashlight and radio.

If you remain at home during the storm, follow these safety precautions:

- Remain indoors and clear of windows, preferably in a central room.
- Turn off the electricity as soon as flooding begins and use flashlights instead of candles or lanterns.
- Open the refrigerator as little as possible so that food will keep longer.
- Stay calm, follow the instructions of local authorities and do not go outside until the "all clear" signal is given.

After the storm has passed, remember to continue using caution and follow these guidelines:

- Listen to instructions from local authorities.
- If you have been evacuated, wait until the authorities tell you it's safe to return.
- Check your food and water supply for spoilage and do not drink tap water until it is deemed safe.
- Inspect for gas leaks using a flash light and sense of smell only. If you detect a leak, use a neighbors phone to call the gas company.
- Check for electrical damage making sure all outlets and appliances are dry before use.

- Look for structural damage to your home and watch for falling debris.
- If you must drive, avoid downed wires, flooded roads and disaster areas.

By using common sense and prior planning, taking care of your family and property will be much easier during what can be a stressful time.

Hurricane Terminology

So that coastal residents can take appropriate action before, during and after a hurricane, it is vital to know and understand typhoon terminology.

The following are some terms often associated with a hurricane and their implications.

Category 1 Hurricane: Storm with winds 75 to 95 mph and storm surges four to five feet above mean sea level.

Category 2 Hurricane: Storm with winds 96 to 110 mph and storm surges six to eight feet above mean sea level.

Category 3 Hurricane: Storm with winds 110 to 130 mph and storm surges nine to 12 feet above mean sea level.

Category 4 Hurricane: Storm with winds 131 to 155 mph and storm surges 13 to 18 feet above mean sea level.

Category 5 Hurricane: Storm with winds in excess 155 mph and storm surges in excess of 20 feet above mean sea level.

Condition 5: This is a normal condition of readiness in which precautionary measures are exercised by all units during the annual hurricane season. This condition will be in effect from 1 June until 30 November of each year.

Condition 4: A hurricane's path has been reasonably well established, and its trend indicates a possible threat of destructive force winds within 72 hours.

Condition 3: The hurricane continues to advance and destructive force winds are possible within 48 hours.



Condition 2: Destructive force winds are anticipated within 24 hours.

Condition 1: Destructive force winds are imminent or expected within 12 hours. This condition also applies when destructive winds are in progress.

Destructive Weather Condition One Caution: Destructive winds are anticipated within 6 hours.

Destructive Weather Condition One Emergency: Destructive winds are currently affecting the MCAS Beaufort area.

Destructive Weather Condition One Recovery: The destructive weather system has passed the area, but storm hazards remain. All orders, restrictions and guidance established in previous DWCs remain in effect. MCAS emergency management is affecting the speedy return to normal operations by eliminating safety concerns, re-establishing services, utilities, clearing debris and performing essential repairs.

Flash Flood Warning: A flash flood is imminent, take immediate action.

Flash Flood Watch: A flash flood in the area is possible, stay alert.

Gale Warning: Issued when winds of 39 to 54 mph (34 to 47 knots) are expected.

Hurricane: Pronounced rotary circulation with a constant wind speed of 75-mph (64 knots) or more.

Hurricane Warning: Issued when hurricane conditions are expected in a specified coastal area in 24 hours or less. Hurricane conditions include winds of 75 mph (64 knots) or more and/or dangerously high tides and waves. Actions for protection of life and property should begin immediately when the warning is issued.

Hurricane Watch: Issued for coastal areas when there is a threat of hurricane making landfall in the Lowcountry.

Storm Warnings: Issued when winds 55 to 74 mph (48 to 63 knots) are expected. If a hurricane is expected to strike the coastal area, gale or storm warnings will not usually precede hurricane warnings.

Hurricane Advisory

Tornadoes: Sometimes spawned by hurricanes, these violently rotating columns of air may produce severe damage and casualties. The typical path of a tornado is 50 feet wide and a few miles long, but some have cut a swath much larger. If a tornado is reported in your area, a warning will be issued.

Tropical Cyclone: The general term for all rotating storms originating over tropical waters.

Tropical Depression: Rotary circulation at the ocean's surface with a highest constant wind speed of 38 mph (33 knots).

Tropical Disturbance: A moving area of thunderstorms in the tropics that maintains its identity for 24 hours or more.

Tropical Storm: Distinct rotary circulation, constant wind speed ranges from 39 to 74 mph (34 to 63 knots).

Typhoon: The name given to hurricanes that develop west of the international date line.

Waterspout: A tornado over water.

Call Guide - Long Distance Calls

STATION-TO-STATION: Call station-to-station if you wish to talk to anyone who answers. Rates are lower than person-to-person. Charging begins when the called telephone answers or PBX answers.

PERSON-TO-PERSON: Call person-to-person when you wish to talk to a particular person or number. Tell the OPERATOR you wish to make a person-to-person call. Rates are higher than station-to-station, and also apply when you talk to an alternate person or extension. Charging starts when conversation begins.

COLLECT: You may call COLLECT if the person or firm you are calling agrees to pay the charge. If you want to make a COLLECT call, please be sure to tell the operator when you place the call.

BILL TO THIRD NUMBER: Customers may place calls and transfer the charge to another telephone. This service requires OPERATOR ASSISTANCE to record the billed to number. The call may be either station-to-station or person-to-person.

NO GOVERNMENT OFFICIAL TELEPHONE MAY BE USED TO PLACE ANY THIRD PARTY OR COLLECT UNOFFICIAL LONG DISTANCE CALLS.

FOR LONG DISTANCE OPERATOR ASSISTANCE, DIAL 9, 9 THEN DIAL "0".

AT&T CREDIT CARD: Dial 9 + 0 + Area Code + 7 digit number. Wait for tone then dial AT&T credit card number.

Telephone Features and How to Use

NOTE: The sign # is called a "pound sign." Where indicated below means to press the "pound sign" first before pressing the number.

CALL HOLD: Allows you to hold any call.

TO ACTIVATE: Flash hookswitch, hear special dial tone, dial #, 4, hang up, (Your call is now on hold: If you hang up, your phone will ring every 60 seconds to remind you; if you do not hang up, there will be on ring.)

TO RETURN: Lift handset; or flash hookswitch if you did not hang up.

TRANSFER: Allows you to transfer a call to another telephone.

TO ACTIVATE: Flash hookswitch, hear special dial tone, dial directory number, consult privately, hang up (if there is no answer or the directory number is busy, flash hookswitch and you will be reconnected.).

CONSULTATION: Allows you to exclude your existing caller, place another call and talk privately with that person.

TO ACTIVATE: Flash hookswitch, hear special dial tone, dial directory number, consult privately, allow consulted party to hang up, you will be reconnected to your original call (If called directory number does not answer or is busy, flash hookswitch and you will be reconnected.)

3-WAY CONFERENCE: Allows you to add a third party to your existing call.

TO ACTIVATE: Flash hookswitch, hear special dial tone, dial desired number, announce conference, flash hookswitch to connect all callers for conference. When conference is completed, hang up (If called number does not answer or is busy, flash hookswitch and you will be reconnected.)

RING AGAIN: Alerts you when a previously busy station or outside trunk becomes idle.

TO ACTIVATE: Flash hookswitch, hear special dial tone, dial 121, hear regular dial don't, hang up.

TO CANCEL: Dial 122, hear regular dial tone, hang up.

CALL WAITING: Alerts you while on your existing call that you have an incoming call waiting for you. You may accept that call without terminating your original call.

TO RESPOND: During your conversation, you will hear two quick beeps. To answer new call, flash hookswitch (first call will be put on hold), talk to incoming caller. Flash hookswitch to alternate between callers. Call-Waiting will not allow conferencing.

CAMP-ON: Alerts you while on your existing call that another call is waiting. You must terminate the original call, hang up, and the camped-on call will ring.

TO RESPOND: During your conversation, you will hear one quick beep. To receive new call, hang up, wait for phone to ring, answer call.

SPEED CALL: (touch-tone only) - Allows you to place calls to any number by dialing a 1 or 2 digit code.

TO PROGRAM: (controller only) - Pick up handset, dial #, 2, hear regular dial tone, dial speed call entry number (00-19), dial number to be stored, hang up (Follow this procedure for each number to be programmed.).

TO CHANGE NUMBER: (controller only) - Pick up handset, dial #, 2, hear regular dial tone, dial speed call entry number (00-19) press *, hang up.

TO USE: Pick up handset, dial #, 3, hear regular dial tone, dial appropriate speed call entry number (00-19). Call will automatically be dialed.

CALL FORWARD: (touch-tone only) - allows you to program your telephone number so that calls to your extension will ring at another number.

TO ACTIVATE: Pick up handset, dial #, 1, hear regular dial tone, dial number calls are to be forwarded to, hang up.

TO CANCEL: Pick up handset, dial #, 1, hear regular dial tone, hang up.

Operation and Maintenance

A. Installation of Telephone Service

1. The MCRD Telephone System is Government owned and maintained and is governed by Depot Order 2060.1 D.
2. The only personnel permitted to install, remove, relocate, or service any of the telephone equipment are the Depot Telephone Branch personnel.
3. There will be no digging, excavating or driving post/pilings along roads within inhabited areas or in any area where buried cable signs are installed without written permission of the Depot Telephone Officer.

B. Request for Telephone Service

1. OFFICIAL

- a. Request for installation, removal, or relocation of the official telephones will be submitted via the Unit S-4 to the Telephone Officer, Building 1050, on a Local Service Request, DA Form 3938. The original and two copies of the form will be forwarded to the Telephone Officer at least five working days prior to date service is desired. Requests of an emergency nature may be submitted at any time but must clearly indicate in the "remarks" section of the DA Form 3938 the nature of the requirement for emergency service. See page 80.
- b. A justification for installation, removal, or relocation must be included in the special requests section of the Local Service Request.

2. UNOFFICIAL

- a. Contractors, concessionaires, etc., requiring telephone service will report to the Telephone Branch for preparation of a Local Service Request. To qualify for service, the applicant must be authorized to conduct business from a fixed location on the Depot. The contract or permit must be presented to the Telephone Branch and the applicable deposit submitted before service will be connected.
- b. Unofficial telephone subscribers will be billed monthly. Subscribers requiring credit adjustment on long distance calls are required to contact the Telephone Branch at extension 2816 prior to 1600, on the 20th of the month in which billing is received. Credit adjustments cannot be applied after the 20th of the month.
- c. Telephone bills will be paid prior to the 20th of the following month for which billing is made. Telephone bills not paid by the

30th of the month due will result in termination of telephone service. However, subscribers who are repeatedly delinquent on payments will receive a letter from the Commanding General stating that any payment received after 1500 on the 20th of the month due will result in immediate termination of telephone service. To regain service, telephone subscribers are to refer to Depot Order 2060.1 D for instructions.

3. PAY STATIONS

- a. The Marine Corps Exchange (MCX) Officer is responsible for the coordination of all pay telephone station services to include allocation, installation, relocation and removal. The Depot Telephone Officer remains responsible for the maintenance of the Government-provided circuitry.

Errors in Directory Listings

The Depot telephone directory is printed annually and is the property of the U.S. Government. It is published for use by the personnel of this Depot and other Government activities. Subscribers in possession of this Directory are responsible for its safekeeping. Any omissions or incorrect appearances should be reported to the Public Affairs Office at extension 3923 for correction of the directory assistance records for the next issue of the directory.

Annoyance Calls

Any person without intent to converse but with intent to annoy any other person, causes any telephone not of his own to ring shall be guilty of a misdemeanor any persons who permits or condones the use of any telephone under his control for such purpose also shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and is subject to a fine or imprisonment.

Obscene Calls

Any customer who receives obscene calls is to immediately contact the Provost Marshal's Office (PMO) at extension 3444 or 2336 for further instructions.

Customer Provided Equipment

Subscribers in Family Housing and Argon Trailer Park can have their own telephone directly connected to the Depot's telephone network. If customers elect to purchase their own telephones(s), the equipment must meet FCC requirements. It is mandatory for customers who wish to connect their own equipment to notify the Depot Telephone Branch at extension 2200 and identify the type of equipment, ringer equivalency and the type of ringer, if any.

Customers who provide their own telephones are responsible for the maintenance and repair of their equipment. If the equipment provided by the customer interferes with the proper operation of the Depot's telephone system, the Telephone Branch may temporarily disconnect the customer's service upon giving notice.

A service charge will apply when and if the Telephone Branch makes a repair or service call and trouble is found to result from the use of customer provided equipment.

Operation and Maintenance

A. Installation of Telephone Service

1. Military or civilian personnel of this station are not permitted to install, remove, relocate, or service any of this equipment. Station personnel are not permitted to enter inside or outside telephone terminal cabinets without permission from the Station Telephone Officer.
2. The installation of Field telephones and/or other unauthorized devices such as field wire will not be connected to the Station Telephone System without prior notification and authorization by the MCAS Telephone Officer. There will be no digging, excavating or driving post/pilings along roads, within inhabited areas or in any area where buried cables signs are installed without written permission of the Station Public Works Office.

B. Request for Official Telephone Service

1. Request for installation, removal, or relocation of the official telephones will be submitted on MCAS Telephone Work Request form MCAS 2100/8 (5-88) and addressed to the Station Telephone Officer via Station S-6.
2. All requests for official telephone service will include the following items:
 - (a) Type of service required (new installation, relocations, change of class of service or disconnect).
 - (b) Building number where service is required.
 - (c) Complete justification for requested service.
 - (d) Person to contact regarding request.
 - (e) Accompanied by a floor plan sketch with existing numbers.

Trouble Reports

PROMPT REPORTING of all telephone equipment failure or operational difficulties will ensure more dependable and efficient service. For repair service dial 228-7036.

IT IS UNLAWFUL TO:

1. Refuse to give up time in an emergency.
2. Make nuisance or malicious telephone calls, or allow your telephone to be used for such calls.
3. Fraudulently obtain service.
4. The use of official Government telephones for the purpose of placing any type of personal telephone calls.
5. Accept collect calls on official Government telephone.

****NOTE****

Use of one of the conveniently located pay telephones listed for all personal business.

PROTECTION OF COMMUNICATION CABLES

Procedures for prevention of damage to all communication cables due to excavation are the responsibility of the Telecommunications Department and NMCI/EDS. The Telecommunications Department should be

notified 48 hours prior to any construction, excavation or demolition to be performed aboard MCAS Beaufort. All excavation or dig requests must be processed through Facilities Maintenance and follow their SOP. On the spot locations can be performed by Station Telephone Office to either clarify or verify information when dig request has already been processed or when cables have been uncovered.

2. If there is an emergency and a locate has to be done after 1600 hours or on weekends, contact SDO at 228-7121 and have them contact the Telephone duty technician. Be sure to leave a contact number and location.
3. After communication cables have been located, the following precautions should be taken when digging near cable:
 - (a) Cable must be exposed by hand—digging, when excavation operations cross or parallel closer than three feet of a cable path. No mechanical digging will be performed within three feet of the crossing point until the cable is physically exposed by hand—digging and there is enough clearance to resume excavation by mechanical means.
 - (b) If digging is within three feet of and parallel to a buried cable, the cable will be located by hand—digging every 12 feet.
4. If the above procedures are not followed and base communication cables are damaged, there will be a repair cost submitted to the responsible agency for materials and labor cost for repair of utilities.

DSN Precedence Calling

Use of the Joint Uniform Telephone Communications Precedence System is directed for all authorized users of voice communication facilities of the Department of Defense (DoD). Since the effectiveness of the system depends upon cooperation on the part of persons authorized to employ it, users must be familiar with the purpose to be served by each level of precedence category and the types of calls, which may be assigned the respective precedences. The following precedences apply:

- (a) **PRIORITY.** Priority precedence is reserved for calls which require prompt completion for national defense and security, the successful conduct of war or to safeguard life or property, which do not require higher precedence. Normally, priority is the highest precedence which may be assigned to administrative matters for which speed of handling is of paramount importance.
- (b) **ROUTINE.** Routine precedence is reserved for all other official communications.
 - (1) All communications placed with military switchboards will be handled as routine communications unless the user requests a higher precedence. Routine communications have no preemption rights.
 - (2) The precedence designations FLASH, IMMEDIATE and PRIORITY will be given preemption rights in order of their listing.
 - (3) FLASH precedence is not available to MCAS Beaufort.
 - (4) Calling instructions are contained in the telephone directory and should be followed when placing either precedence or routine calls.

Defense Switch Network

"DSN"

DESCRIPTION.

The Defense Switch Network (DSN) is the principal long haul, voice communications network within the Defense Communications System. It provides unsecured direct distance dialing service worldwide through a system of government owned and leased automatic switching facilities.

AUTHORIZED USERS.

The Defense Switch Network is provided only to those designated users of Class "AV" telephone service whose authorized usage of long distance telephone communications is required to support Command operations, intelligence, logistics and administrative functions. It will also be provided to civil offices directly connected with national Security and other civil agencies having critical emergency requirements.

ACCESS.

The Defense Switch Network may be accessed by those subscribers having Class "DSN" official telephones only. Access is obtained by dialing the digits "9,4"; then the desired AUTOVON number.

SECURITY.

The Defense Switch Network is NOT SECURE and users are reminded that care must be exercised in accordance with established security instructions to avoid divulging or alluding to classified information.

TELEPHONE MONITORING.

The users of the DSN System should be aware that this DOD System is for official use only and is subject to management monitoring in accordance with DOD Directive 4640.1, and OPNAVINST 2305.14A, Subject: Telephone Monitoring.

TIME LIMITATIONS.

The minimum time required to accomplish the official business, and not normally to exceed 5 minutes.

DATA TRANSMISSIONS.

The use of graphic, facsimile or unsecured voice-data devices can be used only when approved by the Chiefs of Military Services and heads of DOD agencies or activities. Voice-data, facsimile, graphic service in Defense

Switch Network will normally not exceed a continuous transmission time of 18 minutes or a total transmission time of one hour during normal business hours; however, non-busy hours should be utilized to the maximum extent possible. (ACP 121 US SUPP-1 (E).)

PRECEDENCE SYSTEM.

All calls are routine, unless "PRIORITY" precedence is requested and justified.

"PRIORITY."

Priority precedence is reserved for calls which require prompt completion for National Defense and security, the successful conduct of war, or to safeguard life or property, which does not require higher precedence.

"ROUTINE."

Routine precedence is reserved for all other official communications. The facilities of the Defense Switch Network should be used whenever possible to eliminate official commercial toll charges on long distance calls. It is requested that users maintain a list of frequently called DSN numbers.
