## OMB APPROVES CALEA-MANDATED SYSTEM SECURITY FILING REQUIREMENT FOR PROVIDERS OF FACILITIES-BASED BROADBAND INTERNET ACCESS AND INTERCONNECTED VoIP SERVICE

## **ET DOCKET NO. 04-295**

Section 105 of the Communications Assistance for Law Enforcement Act (CALEA), 47 U.S.C. § 1004, and section 229(b) of the Communications Act, 47 U.S.C. § 229(b), require all telecommunications carriers subject to CALEA to file system security and integrity (SSI) plans with the Federal Communications Commission (the Commission).<sup>1</sup> On May 12, 2006, the Commission released the *Second Report and Order and Memorandum Opinion and Order* in ET Docket No. 04-295 (*CALEA Second Report and Order*),<sup>2</sup> which, *inter alia*, declared that facilities-based broadband Internet access providers and interconnected VoIP service providers must comply with this requirement, subject to approval from the Office of Management and Budget (OMB).<sup>3</sup> OMB granted its approval on December 12, 2006.<sup>4</sup>

*Compliance.* Pursuant to section 1.20005 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.20005, facilities-based broadband Internet access and interconnected VoIP service providers subject to CALEA must file their SSI plans with the Commission by **March 12, 2007**. All providers subject to CALEA are reminded that they are required to promptly inform the Commission of any changes to filed SSI plans.<sup>5</sup>

*Filing Procedure.* Facilities-based broadband Internet access service providers and interconnected VoIP service providers filing SSI plans pursuant to this Public Notice must reference ET Docket No. 04-295.

• Parties must file an original and four copies of each filing. Filings can be sent by hand or messenger delivery, by commercial overnight courier, or by first-class or overnight U.S. Postal Service mail (although we continue to experience delays in receiving U.S. Postal Service mail).

All filings must be addressed to the Commission's Secretary, Office of the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission.

- The Commission's contractor will receive hand-delivered or messenger-delivered paper filings for the Commission's Secretary at 236 Massachusetts Avenue, NE., Suite 110, Washington, DC 20002. The filing hours at this location are 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. All hand deliveries must be held together with rubber bands or fasteners. Any envelopes must be disposed of <u>before</u> entering the building.
- Commercial overnight mail (other than U.S. Postal Service Express Mail and Priority Mail) must be sent to 9300 East Hampton Drive, Capitol Heights, MD 20743.
- U.S. Postal Service first-class, Express, and Priority mail should be addressed to 445 12th Street, SW, Washington DC 20554.
- The Commission recognized in its *Report and Order* in CC Docket No. 97-213 that SSI plans are sensitive in nature.<sup>6</sup> Parties who believe their SSI plan should be withheld from public inspection may request confidential treatment pursuant to Section 0.459 of the Commission's rules. They should not file this information electronically.<sup>7</sup> Even if the Commission grants confidential treatment, information that does not fall within a specific exemption pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) must be publicly disclosed pursuant to an appropriate request.<sup>8</sup> We note that the Commission may grant requests for confidential treatment either conditionally or unconditionally. As such, we note that the Commission has the discretion to release information on public interest grounds that does fall within the scope of a FOIA exemption.
