Adobe Acrobat Search

To use the search feature, you must have the Adobe Acrobat Reader with Search Plug-in installed on your computer. If you do not have the search plug-in, you can install the Acrobat Reader from this CD.

Perform Search:

From the *Acrobat Reader* menu bar, execute **Tools Search Query**. A dialog box will be displayed. Enter the text and select Search Options (optional); then press the **Search** button.

After the search has been completed, you will get a list showing all instances of the entered text.

You have three options:

- 1. select (click once) one of the documents in the list and click the **Info** button to view details about the document such as Title, Subject and Author;
- 2. select (click once) a document in the list and click on **View** button and the document will open with all instances of the search text highlighted; or
- 3. double click on one of the documents in the list and the selected document will open with all instances of the search text highlighted.

Troubleshooting

Do not have the *Tools* \rightarrow Search \rightarrow Query option on my menu bar.

If you do not have this option available then you do not have the Acrobat Reader with Search Plug-in installed. You can install the reader from this CD. After installing the software, re-open this document or any data sheet and follow the instructions above.

Search Button Grayed Out

If you have executed the <u>Tools</u> →Search→Query and you get a dialog box with the <u>Search</u> button grayed out, you do not have the index loaded. To load the index, execute <u>Tools</u> →Search→Query and click on the <u>Indexes</u>... button. Click the <u>Add</u> button and go to the CD-ROM drive containing the Dallas Semiconductor CD. Select the dalsemi.pdx document and click <u>Open</u>; then click <u>OK</u>. The <u>Search</u> button should now be black and you can continue your search query.
