

Adobe Acrobat Search

To use the search feature, you must have the Adobe Acrobat Reader with Search Plug-in installed on your computer. If you do not have the search plug-in, you can install the Acrobat Reader from this CD.

Perform Search:

From the *Acrobat Reader* menu bar, execute **Tools→Search→Query**. A dialog box will be displayed. Enter the text and select Search Options (optional); then press the **Search** button.

After the search has been completed, you will get a list showing all instances of the entered text.

You have three options:

1. select (click once) one of the documents in the list and click the **Info** button to view details about the document such as Title, Subject and Author;
2. select (click once) a document in the list and click on **View** button and the document will open with all instances of the search text highlighted; or
3. double click on one of the documents in the list and the selected document will open with all instances of the search text highlighted.

Troubleshooting

Do not have the **Tools → Search→ Query option on my menu bar.**

If you do not have this option available then you do not have the Acrobat Reader with Search Plug-in installed. You can install the reader from this CD. After installing the software, re-open this document or any data sheet and follow the instructions above.

Search Button Grayed Out

If you have executed the **Tools → Search→ Query** and you get a dialog box with the **Search** button grayed out, you do not have the index loaded. To load the index, execute **Tools → Search→ Query** and click on the **Indexes...** button. Click the **Add** button and go to the CD-ROM drive containing the Dallas Semiconductor CD. Select the dalsemi.pdx document and click **Open**; then click **OK**. The **Search** button should now be black and you can continue your search query.
